VisionSpring's Reading Glasses for Improved Livelihoods (RGIL) program was founded in 2006 on the premise that de-medicalizing access to eyeglasses is a core piece in the puzzle of solving uncorrected blurry vision for 1 billion people worldwide. By bringing vision correction services to people where they earn, learn, and live, we are unlocking income-earning potential for those most vulnerable to poverty.

Train and supply Community Agents with quality eyeglasses



Conduct vision screenings in communities, identify presbyopia, and sell reading glasses



Refer customers with other eye conditions to higher level care

RGIL is implemented nationally in Bangladesh and is rapidly growing in Malawi, Uganda, and Zambia. Additionally, in 2022 the World Health Organization incorporated RGIL's community-based methodology in the Training in Assistive Products to encourage governments and others to expand access to vision screening and reading glasses.

As an optometrist, I witnessed first-hand how the existing optical market was failing to provide people in remote and low-wealth areas with the simple eyeglasses they needed. That observation—combined with the belief that community-based care is
